In the Gospels and Acts, Isaiah's prophecy is used as the clue to the mission of Jesus.

Isaiah informs us about the Servant of the Lord's divine identity and global ministry.

## 49:1-2 The Servant's Call

Listen to me, you islands; hear this you distant nations.

'Before I was born the Lord called me; from my mother's womb he has spoken my name.'

49:3 A Sharpened Sword Shadow of his Hand A Polished Arrow

## 49:4 The Servant's Struggle

Never put God on trial. Don't misjudge his love.

He said: 'You are my servant, Israel in whom I will display my splendor.'
I said: 'I have labored in vain;
I spent my strength for nothing at all.'

## **49:4-5 The Servant's Confidence**

Yet what is due me is in the Lord's hand, and my reward is with my God. I am honored in the eyes of the Lord God has been my strength.

May God direct you into God's love and Christ's perseverance.

49:6 Enlarged perspective:

I will make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.

49:7 The Servant's Success

Kings will see you and stand up; princes will see and bow down, because of the Lord, who is faithful, has chosen you.
