Peter is speaking about false teachers in the church and the damage they do. "Of them the proverbs are true: 'A dog returns to its vomit,'

'A sow that is washed returns to her wallowing in the mud' (2 Pet 2:22).

As pigs will be pigs and dogs will be dogs, false teachers live by the instinct to sin.

Jesus: "Watch out for *false prophets* they are *ferocious wolves*" (Matt 7:15-16).

'It is an inevitable hallmark of no longer believing in the second coming that ethics become a matter of private choice and taste. Key issues become **self-fulfilment** and **self-expression** rather than purity and obedience.' (Chris Green)

To the false teacher nothing is sacred:

'blaspheme in matters they do not understand. They are like unreasoning animals, creatures of instinct, born only to be caught and destroyed, and like animals they too will perish' (2 Pet 2:10-12).

To the false teacher nothing is shameful:

'Their idea of pleasure is to carouse in broad daylight. They are blots and blemishes, reveling in their pleasures while they feast with you.'

To the false teacher no one is safe:

'With eyes full of adultery,

they never stop sinning; they seduce the unstable; they are experts in greed – an accursed brood!' (2:14)

Empty WORDS

'These people are **springs without water** and **mists driven by a storm...** they mouth **empty**, boastful **words**

Enticing WORDS

And by appealing to the lustful desires of the flesh, **they entice people** who are just escaping from those who live in error.

Evil WORDS

They will be paid back with harm for the harm that they have done Blackest darkness reserved for them

Follow the way of Balaam Turned their backs on the command

Be comforted by God (2 Peter 2:9)

Be faithful (2 Tim 4:2; John 21:17) shepherds (Acts 20:28-29)

Be followers of truth and of true leaders (Heb 13:7)
